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
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

Daily life was upended When in March of 2020, when becomes colder and most of the world was first introduced to the novel coronavirus COVID-19. People from all walks of life were adversely affected by the pandemic, and certain industries, including travel and tourism, had an especially difficult time as the pandemic wore on.

Tourism greatly affected was largely restricted in early 2020, with some countries prohibiting tourism from travelers from critically impacted areas. As the second wave of the virus arrived in late 2020, many nations returned to full partial lockdowns combat virus to transmission, further hurting the travel and tourism industry.

According to the World E Tourism Travel Council. the tourism industry accounted for 330 million jobs in 2019. Estimates now suggest that approximately 121 million of those jobs have been eliminated due to the pandemic.  - Opal: Gemstones, like flowers, have been assigned certain meanings. Tying the engagement ring to one of them can infuse more symbolism into the relationship. Opal, for example, represents seeking love, passion, creativity, unique spontaneity, and

The cost of a wedding varies depending on geographic location, but according to the business and financial Business resource Insider and The Knot 2017 Real Weddings Study, the average wedding in the United States costs \$31,391.

Insurance policies can help couples protect their wedding investment. Special event insurance provides coverage for various scenarios, including weather, damaged jewelry, gifts, lost

vendor cancellations or no-shows, venues closing before wedding, and canceled weddings, according to Travelers Insurance. Insurance also may cover other unforseen scenarios, such as unexpected expenses from injuries during the wedding or spoiled food.

Policies will directly for any damage or injuries that occur, or reimburse the couple if the wedding is postponed canceled. weddings occur at home, some people's home insurance or umbrella policies may cover certain wedding liabilities. Most

wedding venues carry their own liability insurance, so couples may have overlap there. However, for those who desire extra protection vendor mishaps, it is wise to speak with an insurance orofessional about special wedding coverage.

Prices wedding insurance policies start around \$100 to \$200 for minimum coverage and reach \$1,000 for expensive ceremonies, according

the financial website advisement NerdWallet.

Speak with insurance agent and read policies carefully purchasing before Non-covered typically issues include theft or loss of an engagement ring; rainy days that do not classify as extreme weather; switching vendors after deposit is made; and risky entertainment, such as fireworks or live animals.

Protecting wedding expenditures insurance policies can provide couples with added peace of mind on their big days.

- Provide sanitizer, soap, water, and masks are readily available for all guests. Social distance markers also can be placed on the ground throughout the venue to make it easy for guests to stay six feet apart from one another.
- Choose an outdoor venue. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention notes that the COVID-19 virus spreads very easily through person-to-person contact and that the risk of spreading the virus is greater when spending time indoors. Couples can mitigate some of that risk by tying the knot outdoors and then hosting an outdoor reception where tables are kept at least six feet apart.
